


MARKET UPDATE FOR QUARTER ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

BauMart Holdings Limited (ASX: BMH) ("BauMart" or the "Company") is pleased to present its quarterly cash report for the period ended 31 March 2021 and provides the below operational update for the quarter, in relation to its business divisions (hereafter referred to as the "Group):

Key Points


- Strong third quarter in sales for the Group, despite ongoing supply chain congestion

- Group expenditure for the quarter was in line with normal day to day operations including payments for inventory, staff costs and marketing



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


Materials Handling Division



- Online marketing spend increased during the quarter and will remain in place throughout Q4 FY21
- Historically the second half of the financial year produces higher revenue and a positive finish to FY21 is expected

Key Points

- Improving sales for Q3 FY21 to \$98K
- Ongoing supply of products to customers in the industrial and resources sectors
- The division remains focused on identifying value add projects in sectors where management has significant experience

Other and Net Finance Income

- The underground mining equipment project has been stop start since January 2021 and as a consequence our client is in arrears by 4 months as at 31 March 2021. Discussions for the next phase of equipment and consumables are currently on hold.
- An ongoing contract to provide broad management services to a Perth based industrial distribution business provided recurrent income during the quarter. The contract reached its 12 month expiry on 28 February 2021 but the client has elected to continue on a rolling basis.

Commentary on Appendix 4C

- Net operating cashflows for the quarter was positive at \$33K with a decrease of \$385K in receipts from customers on the previous quarter. The Group continued to invest cashflows (approx. \$1.3m) into inventory to support growing sales which attracted associated costs such as shipping, transport and warehousing costs. Other lease payment obligations for properties were also paid during the quarter.
- Payments to Related Parties of the Company and their associates comprised executive director salaries and non-executive director fees of approx. \$60k.
- At 31 March 2021, the Group had \$0.3m cash at bank and no debt.

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About BauMart Holdings Limited

BauMart Holdings Limited (ASX: BMH) is an Australian public company listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. The origins of the Company began with securing distribution partnerships with suppliers of building materials and its investment and leasing of automated glass-processing equipment. Since its listing in June 2015, the Company has diversified its business across a broad range of divisions including, but not limited to:

- supply of industrial products, including plastic material handling unit load devices;
- supply of building products, including premium volcanic natural stones;
- sourcing, procurement and end-to-end supply chain services; and
- managed services.

Headquartered in Perth with operations in Sydney, Melbourne and Brisbane and overseas in Auckland, New Zealand, the Company has a far-reaching presence and a robust network of infrastructure that is positioned for growth.
