Quarterly Activities Report and Appendix 4C for 31 December 2023

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA – 31 January 2024 – <u>Innlanz Limited</u> (ASX: INL) ("Innlanz" or the "Company"), is pleased to provide an update on its quarterly results for the period ended 31 December 2023. A copy of the Appendix 4C -Quarterly Cash Flow Report is attached.

Net cashflows from operations decreased by \$121k from the previous quarter. This was due to a decrease in cash received from revenue by \$77k, an increase of \$55k in corporate & admin expenses. The Company's total cash position at 31 December 2023 was \$595k which is a decrease of \$109k from previous quarter.

The Group's main income is generated from its hotel asset in Hamilton, New Zealand. The hotel finished the quarter with an occupancy of 76% which is a mixture of corporate, leisure and group based travellers. This mix of business assisted the hotel to capture revenue through its other outlets such as breakfast assisting the hotel to finish the quarter with a total revenue NZD647K.

The Company expects that the revenues for the current quarter will likely be higher, based on strong occupancy rates experienced to date in CY 2024.

The administration and corporate costs for the quarter include \$46k in payment of Non-Executive Directors fees, Managing Director's remuneration and general administrative costs associated with compliance.

As previously advised, the Company continues to evaluate other potential revenue-generating options to build shareholder value through business development and growth opportunities for the Group.

The Board and Management are appreciative of the ongoing support of our shareholders.

Innlanz is a leading retailer of cosmetics, jewelry, health, well-being, and wool products, serving the inbound Chinese tourism market in Australia and New Zealand. The Company currently operates a Hotel in Hamilton New Zealand whilst its retail operations remain suspended temporarily. The Company is focused on business development and growth opportunities in the Hospitality sector and continues to explore and identify strategic business assets to diversify the Group's revenue.
