## Legal Update

The Board would like to announce that the company has resolved its disputes with current defendants, with the exception of the former CEO Robert Allan, in relation to the Alloair transaction which dates back to prior to the 2009 restructure. The company has also resolved its position with a business vendor, with which it has been in dispute since early 2009.

As a result of having resolved these matters the company has recovered close to \$2m in funds.

The company has recently commenced proceedings against the vendor of the company's Perth based business, and ex-employees, relating to a breach of confidentiality and restraint of trade.

The company is confident that these proceedings have very good prospects of success and will keep the market advised of any further substantive developments.
