Broula King Gold Mine


The project is situated about 230 km due west of Sydney near Bumbaldry, lying mid way between the towns of Grenfell and Cowra in the Central West Slopes region of NSW.

Following on from above average rainfall for the period May/September, the region experienced significant rain effectively closing down almost all activities for the quarter. The surrounding area of the Weddin Shire was the first of two regions in NSW declared a disaster area.

Some minor activity was undertaken across the site particularly to ameliorable any damage by the excessive rain throughout the quarter.

Corporate

During the quarter, the Company raised \$500,000 via the issue of 14,928,000 ordinary shares at 3.349 cents per share (\$0.03349).
